


# Elevate your voice

### What is a Member Elected Councillor?

Member Elected Councillors (MECs) sit on Business NSW's State Council and play an important role in the governance of the organisation.

Being an MEC is another way to support our mission and ensure the smooth running of our organisation. MECs are a group of 25 elected members that all share the desire to ensure NSW stays the number one place to own and operate a business.

MECs can contribute to policy, advocacy and membership discussions and initiatives – and you will also be able to have your say in how your fellow members are serviced.

## What is the opportunity?

#### As an MEC you will:

- Get early insights into the big issues impacting your business
- Receive on the ground insights from business leaders across NSW
- Hear directly from government and business leaders
- Have the opportunity to join working policy committees to develop solutions for businesses in NSW
- Be eligible to serve on the board of directors of Business NSW



Being part of Business NSW's State Council is also a great networking opportunity with likeminded, well-connected people within the business community. Council regularly hosts exclusive sit-downs with influential decision makers. Past guest speakers include the NSW Treasurer and other State Government Ministers, Head of the Economics Department at the Reserve Bank of Australia, Senior Government Advisors and policy makers and other key influencers.

Being an MEC is also perfect for someone that is interested in being part of a governance structure of a large established enterprise. Business NSW has been around in various forms since 1826 and we currently employ some 650 office based employees and 5,000 on-hire workers, have a turnover of more than \$260 million per annum and net assets in excess of \$180 million, manage over 15 brands and operate commercial businesses across a range of sectors, including labour-hire and recruitment, law, apprenticeship support and health and community care.

The Council plays an important role and serves as a possible pathway to appointment to the board of the organisation.
